

US Companies Continue to Dominate the 2004 Market for Standard Linear & Data Conversion ICs

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The latest analysis of the standard linear and data conversion ICs market from IMS Research shows that US companies continued to dominate the market in 2004.

Two thirds of 2004 global revenue came from Asia. Despite this, seven of the top ten suppliers were American. Indeed US-owned suppliers accounted for three-quarters of the global market. Analog Devices, Texas Instruments and National Semiconductor remained firmly entrenched as the top 3 suppliers.

“The standard linear and data conversion ICs market grew 24% in 2004, compared with around 28% for the semiconductor industry as a whole” said Peter Cooney, senior analyst in IMS Research’s analog and mixed signal group. “The top five suppliers gained market share in 2004, some seeing well over 30% growth in this market”.

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
